# b. Long Term Recovery Assessment and Summit – Lisa Adler

- Late January received approval from VOAD to seek out funding
- Assessment form has been created and she has been working with the VOAD executive to form the team
- Have a funder to support virtual summit by meeting with individual LTRG members
- Process established to gather individual reports, rolled up into a report which will guide strategic plan
- VOAD Executive Committee is responsible for monitoring and distribution of funding

## **Knights of Columbus**

 no formal report; assisting with food drives and distributions; No Neighbor Left Behind activated

### **Feeding SD**

 providing emergency food boxes across state; central distributions have been set up in Sioux Falls and Rapid City to maximize food and personnel resources; have outreached to 50-60 communities in the last month in South Dakota. Challenges are inventory supply, financial and shipping; hoping to get inventory support from USDA.

#### **LDS Charities**

- manufacturing masks and Sanford is accepting;
- World wide network is attempting to establish food opportunities;

- encouraging members to give blood.
- ACTION: Gayle requested masks; 211 is coordinating so please reach out to 211.

#### MDS

manufacturing masks for the healthcare services in Freeman South Dakota area

#### 211

- over 12,000 phone calls since the beginning; food, rent and household necessities are the priority across the state; calls of fear have transitions to how to get food and make payments;
- Beadle County COVID19 Rental Assistance Fund \$75,000 fund; Assisting FSD with pre-sign up.
- ACTION: VOAD Members please update program information with 211.
- Demand for masks is growing and 211 have a <u>resource online</u> and have had to prioritize the needs.
- **OPPORTUNITY:** VOAD President sent out email to support need for volunteers to support the homeless shelters in Sioux Falls.
- One Sioux Falls Fund \$3.3 M rental assistance up to 70%; over 3,000 applications received; over 1,500 processed with an average of \$600 given out.
- **OPPORTUNITY:** State wide need for volunteers for food distributions.

## **Salvation Army**

- \$50,000 grant awarded for Rental Assistance.
- ACTION: Offline follow up with 211 for intake process.
- Assessing for needs for rental assistance; providing delivery of food boxes for those in need.

### CSS

- rental assistance
- screening for mental health concerns using PHQ2 PHQ2 training is available and will be starting tonight;
- 180 requests for financial assistance.
- ACTION: Betsy to contact Leon to follow up on intake process.

- EOC is working differently then past disasters Department of Health is the lead organization;
- COVID19 stats 1,311 positive, 7 deaths, tested over 10,500 people, 9,239 negative tests,
- hot spot is Minnehaha and Lincoln County 86% are located in these two counties.
- Mid June Peak in the state Minnehaha and Lincoln should peak earlier.
- National Guard has been activated at the state level and is providing support.

- Spring has been good with the risk of flooding reduced;
- James and Big Sioux are still a focus.
- Army Corps feels the Missouri River is at a good level.

 LSS working with CSS to build an information network across the state to gather unmet needs to reduce duplications and get the information gathered through 211 and pushed back out through the network and the VOAD.
