#### Update on donated beds

- 186 bunk beds were donated to tribal communities (did not include mattress)
- LSS received a grant to purchase mattress able to get all 186
- o Will be ready for pick up in about a month
- o Great to get kids up off floors, off moldy beds, no longer needing to share
- o Able to supply the Pine Ridge Volunteer Center as well
- o Still working out logistics to get the bunk beds and mattresses distributed
- Some are able to pick up from Brookings (current location)
- Ideas to get the rest out:
  - Partner with Food Pantry as they do deliveries?
  - Coordinate with PWNA?
  - Jim Pearson (Roberts Co. EM) has offered to meet someone from Pine Ridge halfway
  - Maretta C. is still working on transportation

#### Volunteer Center update

o nearly done, currently doing interior work

#### Afghan Evacuees (Humanitarian Parole)

- o Many other state VOADs are working to assist with Afghan Evacuees
- SD is not slated to take any evacuees at this time
- Major issue is immigration status and assistance available
- Refugee status provides funding to help with placement, English and Job skills training, short-term housing, and medical. Also allowed to work.
- Parolee/Evacuee status is not eligible for any of that making it incredibly difficult to assist.
- Additional information on evacuee process

- o Red Cross has deployed to military bases that are housing evacuees.
- Large number of needs but no asks yet
- o Wisconsin VOAD has asked for help and St. Vincent is responding @ Fort

- McCoy. small base not a lot of space for donations
- Current need is warm coats and clothing.
- Wisconsin Adventist Community Services assisting there, has warehouse and working on collections

#### COVID Update

- SD is seeing another spike in cases due to Delta variant
- No requests or needs so far
- Wounded Knee has immediate needs for food deliveries as school has gone virtual.
- Looking for canned food to take directly to kids
- Have man power but need to get food
